Carbon Early Childhood Literacy: <u>Dolly Parton</u> <u>Imagination Library,</u> <u>Reach out and</u> <u>Read/Brush, Book,</u> <u>Bed, Talk-Read-Sing,</u> Ready4K: Rosemarie Lister	Ready4K is a free, evidence-based family engagement program that is delivered by text message and Carbon County families can sign up immediately. The content is for kids age zero to 10, and you can upload your family's information to personalize the type of text messages you receive. Talk-Read-Sing is a community engagement program that shares the importance of talking, reading, and singing. It is a public messaging campaign that uses posters, bookmarks, t-shirts to engage families out in the community.
	Dolly Parton Imagination Library currently has 675 families in Carbon County signed up. Reach Out and Read, which is with the Pennsylvania American Academy of Pediatrics, is a program that every time a child comes to their well visit at a St. Luke's practices in Carbon County, the entire staff trained. The visits provide the child with an age appropriate book and a lesson on why literacy is important. The program also includes messaging on Brush, Book, Bed since Carbon is a dental shortage area.

BKK Street Outreach Program (Jen Pantella): Since launching in March the BKK Street Outreach Program has served 88 households with 142 encounters and has given out 89 resource packets, 725 Ibs. of emergency food, 610 toiletries items, and 19 backpacks to homeless encampments. We are currently collecting items for winter for the homeless: tents, blankets, hand warmers, heating sources. The Resource Center Office at St. Peter's is complete and open to the public by appointment only, and we are planning a date for Grand Opening. We are also hiring an additional Community Resource Specialist (BIG Thanks to 20/20 circle grant) to hopefully start in the new year. Cancer Support Community: We began offering weekly programs at Turn to Us, Inc. Nesquehoning in September (Wednesdays at noon). Our upcoming programs are: Intro to Tapping, Reiki Meditation, Abundance Bound, Holiday Crafting, and QiGong for Self-Care. We also offer individual counseling support and access to resources to reduce stress and improve quality of life. To register, people affected by cancer can call (570) 732-4220 or (610) 861-7555. We'd love to welcome new people. **Carbon County Area Agency on Aging:** Aging has partnered with the Angels for Aging program and the Frailey Insurance and Financial Services to provide Christmas gifts to Seniors that have no or limited family. The gift card can be picked up at the Frailey Insurance and Financial Services office on Coal Street in Lehighton.

Career Link Carbon County: Samuel Hellen will be stepping up to Gary Wentz's position as Gary will be retiring. Heather Brown will be stepping up to Sam's position at the same time.

Carbon Corps: CarbonCorps is still recruiting mentors for 2 school-based positions. We are excited to now have a mentor with Lehigh Valley Children's Center at their new location in Palmerton. Our Panther Valley Elementary school mentor is working on Thanksgiving food distribution to be held November 19. Our Weatherly mentor is working on getting the Holiday Hope Chests from LV Volunteer Center for holiday distribution. Carbon County "Right from the Start": Serves as an in-home visiting program, with parent education and kindergarten readiness. There are currently 15 families in the program and are accepting more. The program is free of charge and must be a resident of Carbon County and agree to participate in at least one home visit per month. Currently in a virtual format.

Carbon, Monroe, Pike Drug and Alcohol: Still seeing people in person, with exceptions to telehealth. Able to hold their first recovery simulation a few weeks ago at ESU with a total of 33 participants. Looking to have a simulation in Carbon County, projected for November. If anyone needs Narcan, please contact our office. Starting up the Christmas tree decoration again with St. Luke's. The trees will be decorated with recovery information. **CMP System of Care:** Jason Frei from St. Luke's Behavioral Health and Larissa Kimmel are new trainers for the Prepare School Based Safety Planning Curriculum. They are working on a plan to offer one day Workshop 1 (6.5 in-person presentation/credit hours; .5 online preworkshop hours) and 2 full days for Workshop 2 (12 presentation/credit hours) to interested school districts. The curriculum was created by the National Association of School Psychologists with the goal of assisting school safety teams in developing more comprehensive safety and crisis planning. *The next Carbon County System of Care Meeting will be December 14 at 1:30pm. <u>https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/HR2HFRR</u>*

Domestic Violence Service Center: We are seeing people in our Carbon County Office now and are seeing an increase in people for filing for PFA's. If you have a client that might need help or might be in a domestic violence situation and just need to talk, please call our office as we do counseling. One on one. Counseling in our office, in the Carbon Office and in our Wilkes-Barre office.

East Central AHEC: Please see our website in conjunction with Northeast AHEC for more information on our CHW training programs, Princeton Review SAT/ACT Prep course offering, SEARCH Academy, and Commonwealth Civilian Coronavirus Corps. We received CDC funding to train Community Health Workers in response to Covid-19 and are offering free training for a limited number of individuals. We have a new center director, Lori Chaplin Masterson. We just finished a community health worker training program in partnership with St Luke's. We are offering the Princeton Review for high school students and this is open for all high school students. It's a discounted fee of \$60.00 through AHEC. Normally the price is \$299 and it's a self-paced online prep course and it's open to any high school student. We also just started our search Academy again back in September. This is a virtual program that is held every second Tuesday of each month except for December. Students receive hands on materials for an activity and hear from speakers in different health care careers. All the AHEC's in the state received a CDC COVID-19 grant to train 200 individuals across the state as community health workers. The Northeast region also received additional funds for the Commonwealth civilian coronavirus core. This is a National Health care program and pays members a living stipend. Living allowance stipend of \$15.00 an hour for a one-year commitment. They also get other benefits like an education scholarship if they need health care insurance.

Family Promise: The office has moved into the Nesquehoning campus, working out of the rectory. Working to bring the families in, working on a few things that still need to be completed.

LCCC: LCCC Hosts Virtual Job Information Sessions

Lehigh Carbon Community College (LCCC) will host virtual information sessions for adjunct instructor positions open in all academic divisions. Sessions will include an overview of the hiring process, as well as training and can lead to teaching positions starting in the spring 2022 semester.

LCCC Honors Scholars Program Accepting Applications

Applications are now being accepted for the fall 2022 Honors Scholars program for prospective students who would like to concentrate more seriously on academics and who are intellectually curious and highly motivated. Scholars receive a full tuition scholarship, covering tuition and fees after all Federal Pell grants and institutional scholarships are applied. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA to

be eligible for the scholarship each semester. Students have the option of applying to one of two tracks - Liberal Arts or Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM). In addition, high achieving students who have completed 15-30 credits as dual enrollment students, current LCCC students or students who have transferred in to LCCC from other institutions are encouraged to apply to the Honors College program, which is a one-year scholarship opportunity. Lehighton Area Memorial Library: We have been having a real increase in people coming into the library sent by different agencies and different places to get help with applications online, finding Social Security card applications, and anything you can imagine. The carbon libraries will be reaching out to different agencies and trying to get some contacts and things that we can get some help with. We can't always give people what they need because we don't have the staff and we don't have the resources. So, if anybody is interested in finding out what we can do or helping us with some of that, we'd be really interested.

Lehigh Valley Health Network: Campus moving along quickly, and we have programs we will be bringing to the county. Will have more information at next meeting as we still have things we are polishing up.

Pathstone: Currently in need of teaching staff. There are currently 5 classrooms closed because of being short staffed. Enrollment is at about 50% right now.

Pennsylvania Linked to Aging and Disability Resources: We are getting back into doing live meetings as of September. There will be a live meeting December 16th up at senior care of planes up in Luzerne County. We're getting a good number of groups maintaining social distancing and wearing masks and everything, but we're doing very well. Next R VA live meeting will be January 26th from 10-12:30pm. The topic will be mental health during COVID-19.

Penn State Extension: Offering nutrition education classes to low income parents of children 19 and under and senior citizens. Topics include how to eat healthy, save money on a budget while under budget, and basic nutritional information. Recently updated their pregnancy program.
 Representative Heffley's Office: Please know that we continue to help with Unemployment issues and LIHEAP and PA1000 Property Tax and Rent Rebate applications.

Self-determination Housing of Pennsylvania: We are working with landlords right now. What we call landlord engagement. So, we're looking for if there are any landlord organizations in each county and training landlords about what's happening with people around housing assistance animals. Hopefully trying to get landlords to accept vouchers and subsidized programs. We have gotten the adaptive

modifications grant, so we are working statewide to make people houses accessible: Bathrooms, ramps, chairlifts. Also looking to hire two regional housing coordinators in Eastern PA. <u>SDHP Calendar</u>

St. Luke's University Health Network: The new Carbon Campus Hospital will be opening November 20th. The new hospital will be offering 24/7 critical care. The Lehighton Campus will grow their mental health services. Plans to open a walk-in center for mental health services.

St. Luke's University Health Network, Pocono Mountains United Way, and the AllOne Foundation are partnering together in sponsoring a Certified Recovery Specialist/Certified Family Recovery Specialist (CRS/CFRS) Training offered at no cost to registered participants! A CRS/CFRS serves as a role model, mentor, advocate, and motivator to recovering individuals to help prevent relapse and promote long-term recovery. Individuals must have 18 months of continuous recovery at the time of application to the training. Trainings will be conducted by The Pennsylvania Recovery Organizations – Alliance (PRO-A) at the Mountain Center, 354 Memorial Boulevard, Tobyhanna, PA 18466. This series also meets the PCB Educational requirements for the CRS. St. Luke's Community Health Department is also working on a project right now to try to improve confidence in the COVID-19 vaccines. We are looking to partner with some agencies in the area that may want to be champions of that.

Turn to Us: Partnered with the Cancer Support Community of the Greater Lehigh Valley in September. Currently getting ready for the holiday season with a few different projects. Will be providing gift cards for Thanksgiving and Christmas to our families along with meal recipes. 
