Carbon County Area Agency on Aging: We were able to provide presents for 40 seniors through the Angels for Aging programs. We are seeing an increase in Protective Services report, referrals and out reaches to consumers.

Carbon County "Right from the Start": We are continuing to serve families in a virtual format. We currently have approximately 10 families enrolled. Please contact us a 570-249-8560 with any referrals.

Carbon, Monroe, Pike Drug and Alcohol: Currently providing services in-person and virtual as well.

Eastcentral AHEC: Lori Chaplin-Masteron is the new center director. Eastcentral AHEC has been contracted by LHVN to collect data for their Community Health Needs Assessment in Carbon County. LCCC (Amber Zuber): Face-to-face enrollment at the Morgan Center has increased by 47% for this spring. Still requiring masking and classes begin January 18^{th.} Starting a food share program for students, faculty, and staff who may be experiencing food insecurity. Able to take 3-5 grab and go items each day in help to offset any hunger or cost issues on campus.
