Community Foundation specialize in **place-based** giving, established for the **permanent** benefit of a specific geographic region

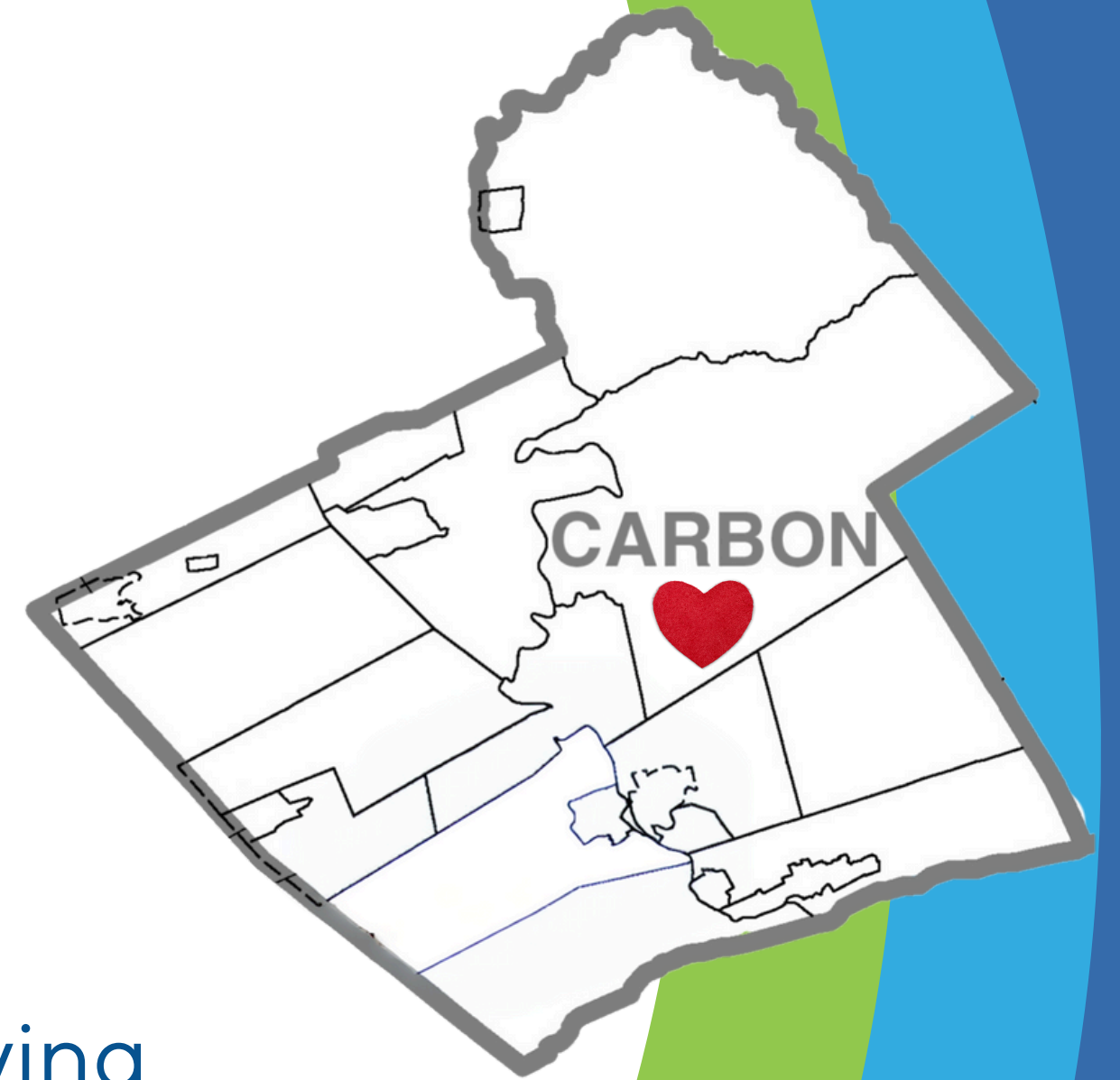

- April - May - Application Review
 - Monitor your email for communications and follow-up!
- May 18th - Grants Decisions
- June 1st - Notifications to Applicants
- June TBD - Grants & Scholarships Awards Program
- April 30, 2027 - Funds must be spend and report due
 - Extensions granted on a case-by-case basis



Common Mistakes & Tips for Success

- Don't apply blind
 - Attend the info session and reach out to the Foundation if you have questions.
 - Remember the people behind the application
- Keep responses clear and concise
 - Share what matters most—avoid extra words or jargon.
 - Say as much as you can in as few words as possible

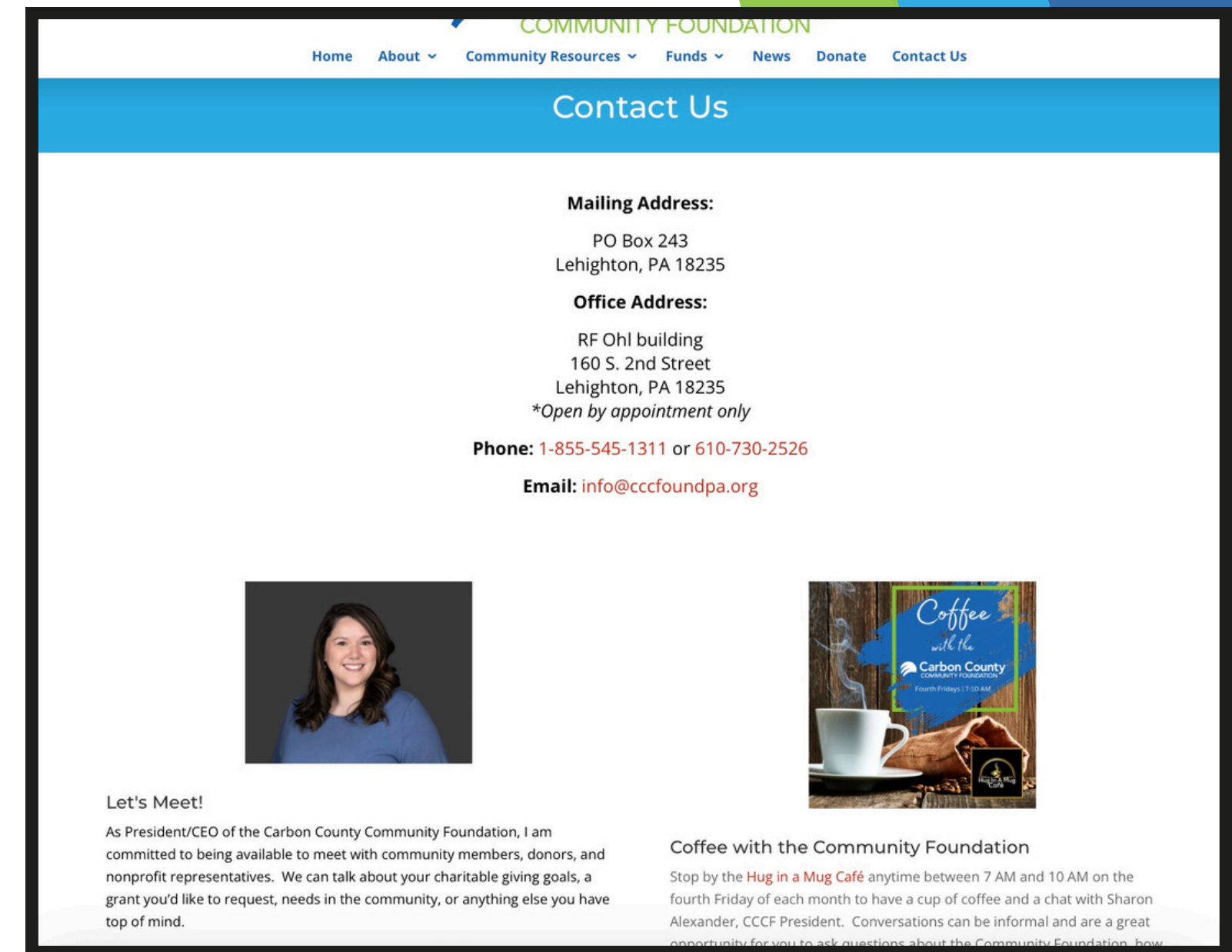


Common Mistakes & Tips for Success

- Have someone outside your organization review it
 - If they're confused, reviewers may be too.
- Submit a complete, clear budget
 - Show exactly how grant funds will be used.
- Make sure your story and budget match
 - The narrative and numbers should clearly align.

- Supports all manner of scouting activities in Carbon, lower Luzerne (Greater Hazleton), & Northern Schuylkill Counties
- Campership (individuals or entire troop); Facilities upkeep and repair, Eagle Scout/Gold Award projects;
- Grants average \$250-\$750
- Number of people served is key

For individual campership, grant is awarded to troop on behalf of child. No grants directly to individuals

Penny Allison Early Childhood Education Fund

- Elementary School, Pre-K Counts, Head Start, and other nonprofit organizations serving children and families in Carbon County
- Early learning programs, school readiness, and enrichment experiences for young learners (field trips, creative materials, etc)
- Grants average \$600-\$1,000

Computer Career Accelerator Fund

- Grants to support career awareness and skills development in the computer/IT fields
- Carbon County highschool or college students
- Preference given to programs that offer mentorship and hands-on work experiences.
- Grants average \$5,000 - \$10,000
 - Multi-Year Grants Allowed

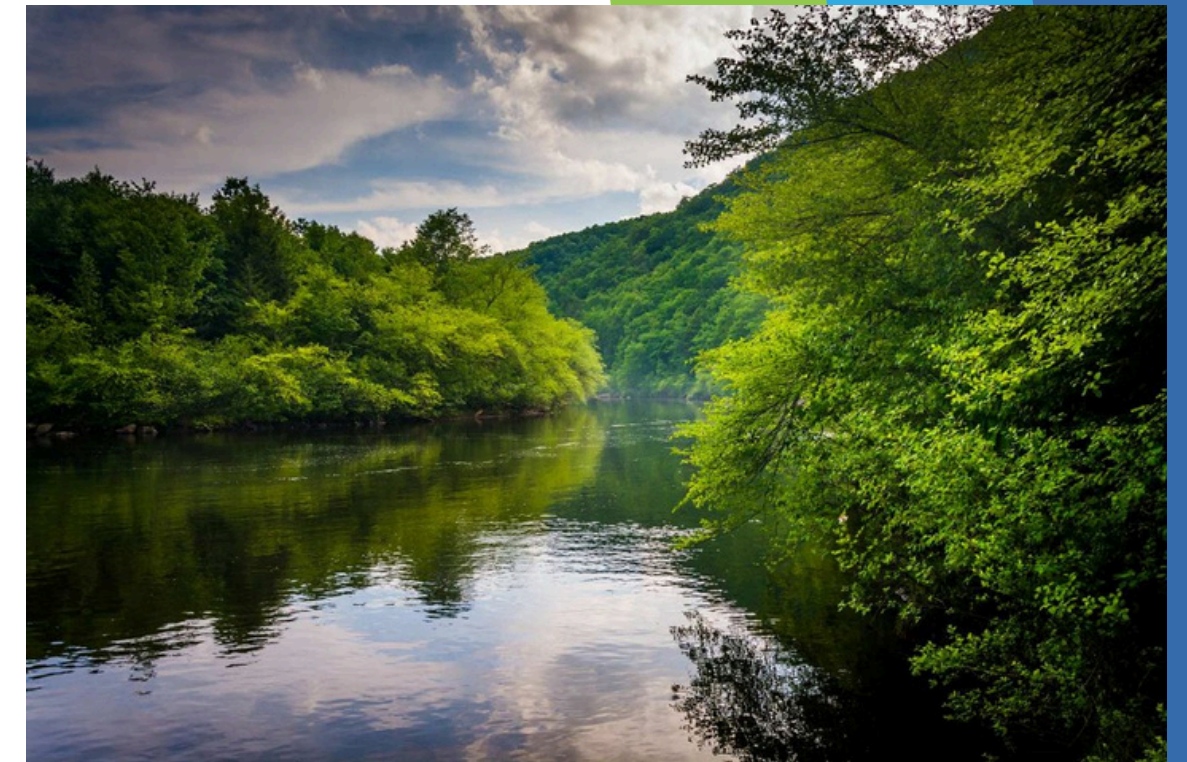
Carbon County Creative Arts Fund

- Supports artistic pursuits for benefit of Carbon County
 - Fine arts (painting, sculpting, etc)
 - Performing arts
 - Music
 - Photography, Film, & Graphic Arts
- Preference given to programs for adults, but kids' programs will be considered
- Grants average \$1,500 - \$2,000
 - Fund for Carbon County application



Fund for Carbon County

- Our most flexible fund for grantmaking
- Six key focus areas:
 - Arts & Culture
 - Community & Economic Development
 - Education & Scholarships
 - Environment & Historic Preservation
 - Health & Human Services
 - Youth Programs
- Grants average \$1,000-\$2,000



Fund for Carbon County - Guidelines

- 501c3 nonprofit organizations are encouraged to apply. If you do not have a 501c3 status, you may still be eligible. Contact me!
- Applicant should have authorization from leadership to apply on the organization's behalf.
- Applicants are welcome to request all manner of support, but preference is given to projects or programs vs. general operating support.
- The project or program should be completed within the 12-month period following the award.
- Applicants are strongly encouraged to list other resources, including in-kind support, in their project budgets.



Fund for Carbon County - Application Req.

- Organization Contact Info, including EIN
- Mission statement
- Summary of program or project
- Description of audience served by program or project
- Explanation of the need for this program or project
- Project timeline
- Total cost of program or project, with budget detail
- Organization's annual operating budget (figure only)
- Amount requested
- IRS Determination Letter
- Board of Directors list

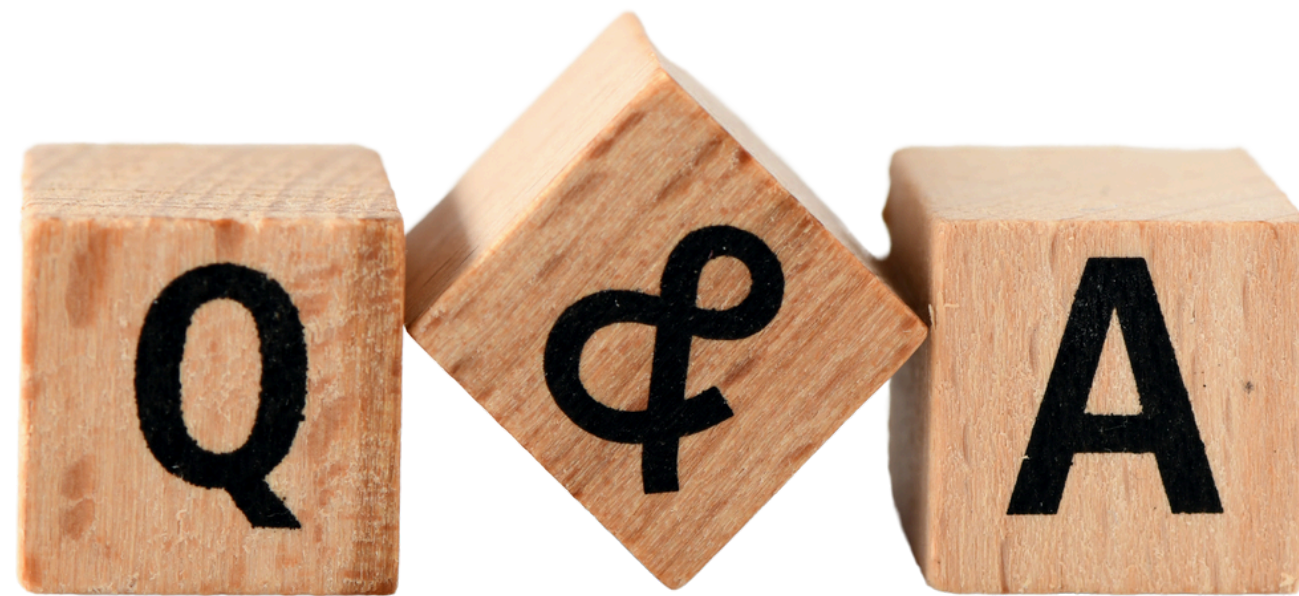


Fund for Carbon County - Evaluation

- **Strategy/Feasibility:** Does proposal have clear goals, including a well-thought-out timeline? Does proposal present a solid strategy for achieving anticipated goals?
- **Community Need:** Is there a significant, critical, localized, and timely need for the program or project proposed?
- **Impact/Return on Investment:** Will program or project have a significant, far-reaching, and/or long-lasting impact on Carbon County and its residents?
- **Sustainability:** Is proposal realistic and attainable? Does the organization have the intent and capacity to sustain the program?
- **Budget/Organizational Health:** Are project expenses and other revenue sources realistic considering audience size and stated goals? Is the organization financially secure? Is the leadership/board actively engaged in organizational governance and success?
