1. **CCCF:** 16 scholarships opened today and due 3/1/26, Jan 21 they partnered with NEPA for grant writing workshop at 911 Center in Nesquehoning, 1/23 hosting a grants info session for spring cycle opening, encouraged to attend if applying. Poc Mtn Visiting Bureau has grant available for those who promote tourism
2. **LCCC** (Amber Zuber): Part time position available for academic advisor; great for retired professional, classes begin 1/23 and have scholarship opportunities to cover up 90% of tuition
3. **Catholic Charities** (Andrea Neagle, Lisa Geosits) looking for dates for the food truck (mobile kitchen on wheels) Carbon County, booked in Schuylkill County.
4. **CMP CMP MHDS** (Ashley Highland, Larissa Kimmel) targeted CM referrals, hiring a case worker, CAMS coordinator (Collaborative Assessment Management of Suicide) evidence based, regardless of insurance, to divert from needing hospitalization to reduce suicidal ideation, working on the LOSS team and will offer spring trainings, trauma trainings in the works

9. **Maternal and Family Health Services WIC** (Cindy Kennedy) has reproductive health services available in Lehighton; services for teens and woman for breast and cervical screenings including woman who are uninsured, personal hygiene pantry, nutrition program updates in April, adding a mobile unit to cover Carbon County beginning spring and summer
